How to Use This Checklist

Balancing strategic work with operational pressure isn't about willpower or time management - it's about design. This checklist is meant to help you assess whether your current operating system protects strategic progress or quietly allows it to be crowded out by day-to-day demands.

Use this as a diagnostic, not a judgment. Read each statement and answer honestly based on how your organization operates most of the time, not how it operates on its best days. The goal is to surface where operational pressure is eroding strategic capacity—and where small structural shifts could have an outsized impact.

Complete the checklist quarterly, or anytime operational pressure feels overwhelming or strategy starts slipping.

Scoring System

For each statement, score yourself using the following scale:

- 0 = Not true
- 1 = Sometimes true
- 2 = Consistently true

Add up your total score once you've completed the checklist.

Score Interpretation

0-8: Strategy Is At Risk

Operational pressure is likely consuming most available capacity. Strategy exists, but it is vulnerable and inconsistently reinforced.

• 9-16: Strategy Is Competing With Operations

Strategic intent is present, but execution pressure frequently overrides it. Structural adjustments could meaningfully restore balance.

• 17-24: Strategy Is Protected

Strategic work is integrated into the operating system. Operational pressure still exists, but it no longer crowds out long-term progress.

How to Apply the Results

Once you've completed the checklist, resist the urge to treat the score as a verdict. Instead, use it as a signal. Look for patterns across the lowest-scoring sections - those areas usually point to where operational pressure is quietly eroding strategic capacity. Start by addressing one or two leverage points, such as clarifying ownership, adjusting the operating cadence, or tightening decision paths. Small structural changes often restore strategic focus faster than broad reorganizations or added effort. Revisit the checklist regularly to track whether your system is protecting strategy as conditions change.
